







Comiskey Park, c. 1912.






Comiskey Park score book, 1917.

Charles Albert Comiskey, the Old Roman, President and owner of the Chicago American League Club, was born in Chicago, August 15, 1858. He began his baseball career in 1878 with the Dubuque, Iowa, team. In 1882 he joined the St. Louis Browns, and in 1883 was made manager of the team. He took charge of the Players' League Club in Chicago in 1890. He then returned to St. Louis in 1891, and in 1892 went to Cincinnati, where he managed the Reds until 1895. In 1900 he established the Chicago White Sox of the American League.




