

Newspaper

Recommended for Grades 9 and 12

Download and print the artifact images that go with the narrative you have finished reading.

Ask students to select one historic topic in the narrative to focus on. Give students time to conduct further research on the topic using the Internet, library, and your textbook. Instruct students to write a newspaper article on their topic that is accompanied by one or more of the artifact images from the narrative. You can assign a writing category and length or let students select. Some options are:

- A Letter to the Editor—a persuasive writing piece
- A Feature Story—a descriptive, human interest piece
- A News Article—a factual, expository writing piece

Create a "front page" for your classroom newspaper and arrange student submissions to create a full edition. Make copies and distribute to the class.
