<b>Great Migration</b>	the term that describes the 1916–70 migration of thousands of African Americans who moved from the southern states seeking a better life in northern cities
<b>jazz</b>	an ever-changing and evolving form of music, at times improvisational, that originated in the United States and was heavily influenced by African Americans
<b>sharecropping</b>	a system of agriculture that emerged in the South after the Civil War and the end of slavery, in which a tenant farmer does not own the land he cultivates and so must pay the landowner a share of the crops he produces as rent and to cover other expenses including equipment and seed

<b>snap my cap</b>	get mad
<b>split</b>	to leave
<b>break it down</b>	go to town
<b>hand me that skin</b>	shake hands
<b>lay down some hot licks</b>	a good phrase or solo played in a jazz composition

<b>giggle-water</b>	an alcoholic drink, especially whiskey or gin
<b>black and tan club</b>	a nightclub that catered to both black and white patrons
